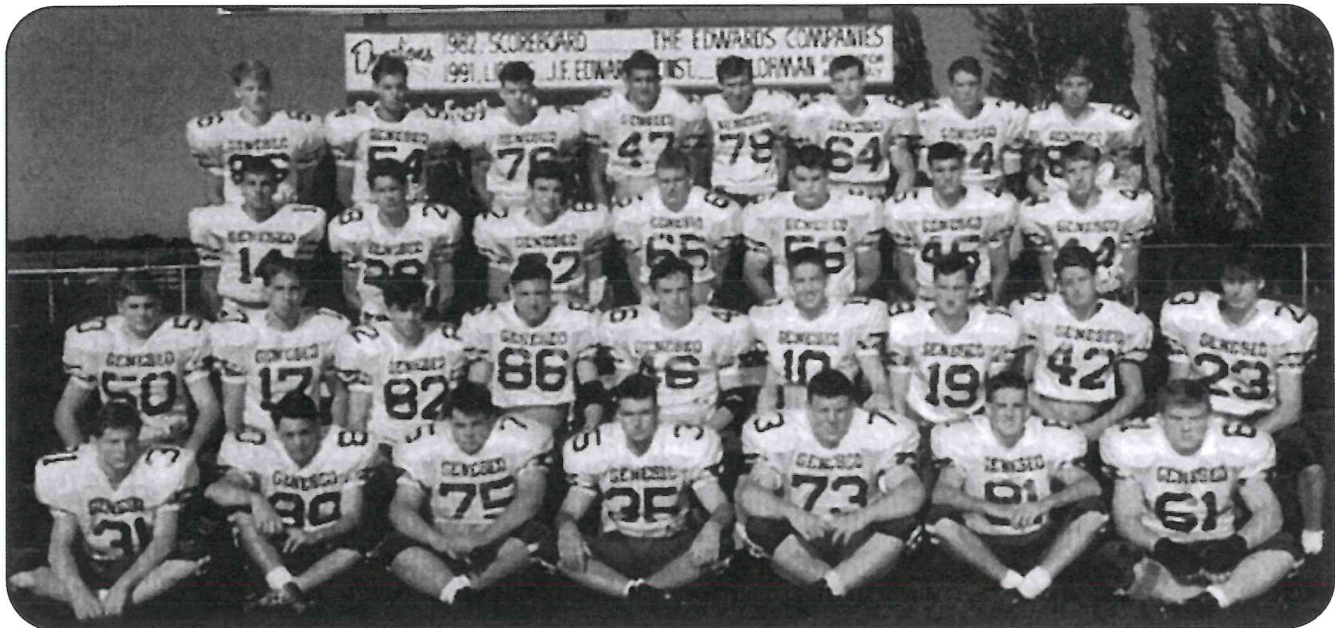
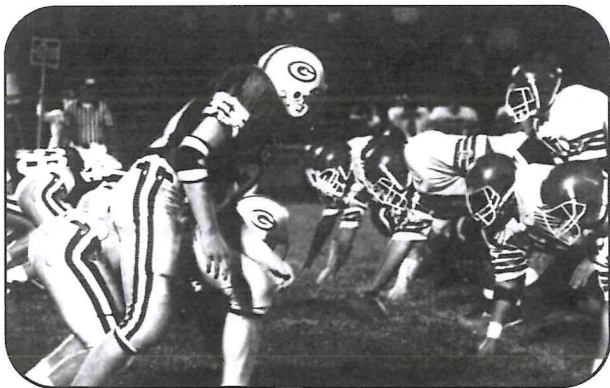

The 1992 Geneseo High School football season was one for the record books. The Green Machine started the season off against Galesburg and smashed their way to a 32-7 victory.



Then they went to Chicago for back-to-back games against Washington and Lindblom, winning the games 33-0 and 48-0. Geneseo then went to conference rival LaSalle-Peru for a 36-0 blowout. With their first four games only allowing 7 points they allowed 13 in a 54-13 win against Streator. Geneseo came home for a close 10-6 win against another Conference opponent Dixon. The Leafs closed out the regular season with wins over Ottawa, Sterling and Harlem.



They went into the playoffs with an unblemished record and kept the momentum with a thrilling 13-10 road win over Peoria Manual. In round two, the Green Machine advanced with a hard-fought 13-3 victory over a physical Rock Falls squad. Coach Denny Diericx's team then cruised to a 27-10 win over Peoria Notre Dame. With one game away from the state championship the Maple Leafs won a 7-6 battle against Decatur. In the State Championship the Leafs lost a very hard-fought game 14-6 to Oswego.
