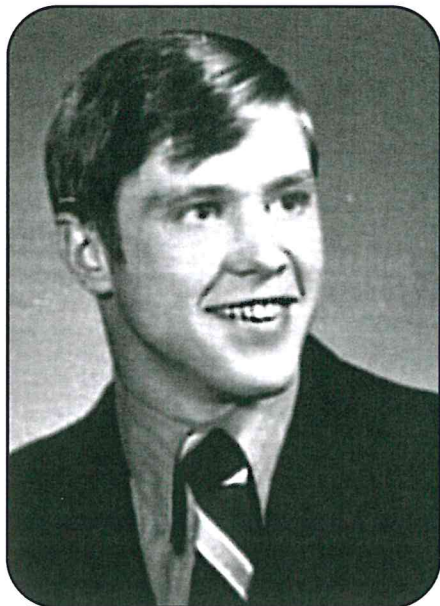

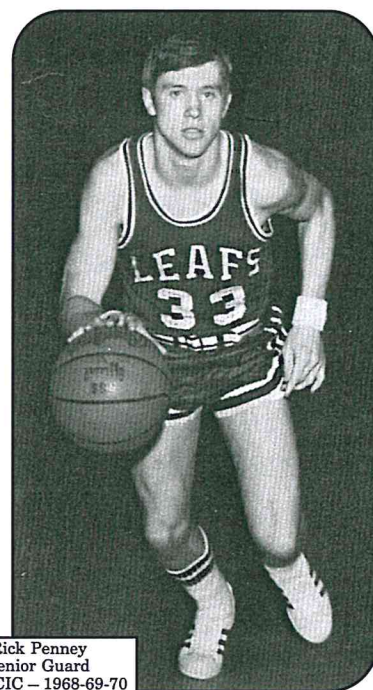
GHS Class of 1971



GHS Athletic Hall-of-Famer Steve Penney says pound-for-pound, the best all-around athlete to ever wear Geneseo green and white was right down the hall — his younger brother, Rick Penney. That green and white gear worn by the younger Penney was on the football field, basketball court, and GHS track. Penney is best-known for being the field general for possibly GHS' greatest football team, the 1970 Green Machine. Penney quarterbacked the Maple Leafs to a victory every time he took the field, including that legendary win over Ottawa in his senior year. After being named captain of the All-State football team, Penney continued his playing days as a defensive back for the Iowa Hawkeyes, lettering three times. Penney also starred on the Maple Leaf hardwood and held the Long Jump school record for 35 years.
